Like its sequel, the Statesman the dialogue is unusual in that Socrates is present but plays only a minor role. Socrates engages him in discussion and Ion explains how his knowledge and skill is limited to Homer whom he claims to understand better than anyone alive. At first he starts with the use of a mundane model a fisherman which shares some qualities in common with the target kind the sophist.

And for this reason God takes away the mind of these men and uses them as his ministers, just as he does soothsayers and godly seers, in order that we who hear them may know that it is not they who utter these words of great price, when they are out of their wits, but that it is God himself who speaks and addresses us through .
