The mourning dove is sometimes called the "American mourning dove" to distinguish it from Mourning Dove distantly related mourning collared dove *Streptopelia decipiens* of Africa. Over 2 to 4 days, the Mourning Dove carries twigs to the female, passing them to her while standing on her back; the female weaves them into a nest about 8 inches .

The mourning dove was thought to be the passenger pigeon's closest living relative. The beak is short and dark, usually a brown-black hue. In July and August before migration, they form post-breeding flocks. Mourning doves are light grey and brown and generally muted in color. The clutch size is almost always two eggs.
